Barbon Parish Council - Latest News

Speed Limit through Barbon Village: Following a number of concerns from Barbon residents, the Parish Council approached Westmorland and Furness Council



(WFC) Councillor Hodgson regarding complaints of vehicles speeding through the village. New legislation now makes it easier for councils to request a 20mph speed limit. Barbon Parish Council registered an interest in this with WFC who are preparing a report outlining advice and solutions. We are hoping to take receipt of this by the end of March when we will make this document open to public consultation. The date of this will be circulated. **Parking in Barbon Village:** WFC have been approached regarding parking issues in the village. This has been noted and although it is not within the remit of the Parish Council to take action, a letter has been sent to the cottage owners concerned to encourage responsible parking and not to block access for emergency vehicles.

Street Lighting in Barbon: The Parish Council is in contact with WFC regarding the audit and maintenance of street lighting in Barbon.

Auction of land known as the Cricket Pitch.

Councillors have been approached by concerned residents regarding this. The Parish Council has no jurisdiction over the auction of this piece of land, and until any planning application comes before the Council, we cannot comment. However, if you are concerned and wish to form some form of cooperative with a view to buying the land, then you are entitled to come to the Parish Council meeting and ask for some sort of support.

News from St. Bartholomew's

Bell Ringing

St Bartholomew's Church in Barbon is a great location for learning to ring church bells. We have recently had a lot of work done in the tower. In the ringing room we have new heaters and improved lighting to make it more comfortable, especially in the winter.

The church was built in 1891-3 with a bell frame for 6 bells – but only 4 bells were fitted. In 2005 a further

two bells were added, donated by a local parishioner. The spacious ringing room makes it particularly suitable for learning and practising.

We really need some volunteers from Barbon and the local villages to help keep the bells ringing. We would like to ring for Sunday morning services, which is a large part of why the church has bells, but we need more ringers to be able to do this.

Anyone can learn to ring and the process is fun and rewarding. There's no commitment and you can only know what it's like by having a go. It's not physically hard work, strength is not required and Quasimodo is not representative of a typical bell ringer!


